### Monitoring Feedback from Local Authority

We recently welcomed a visit from the Local Authority's Leaders of Education, who came to review and monitor our school's progress. We are delighted to share that the feedback was very positive, reflecting the hard work and dedication of our entire school community.



Our pupils were, as always, a credit to us—engaged, articulate, and confident in discussing all aspects of their learning. We are incredibly proud of how they represented Frenchay.

Here are some highlights from the review report: "Leaders at Frenchay Primary School demonstrate a clear and ambitious vision for their pupils. There is a strong culture of school improvement, underpinned by high aspirations for all learners. Pupil outcomes in 2025 across all key stages were strong and exceeded national averages. The Headteacher sets high expectations." The report also commended the professional development opportunities provided to staff, noting the valuable partnership with a local school. This has included targeted phonics support for the Early Years team, pedagogical development through teacher visits, live coaching, and team-teaching opportunities.

Well done, Frenchay! We are all very proud of the continued progress we are making to ensure our school remains the best possible place for our children to learn and thrive.

### Staff Training and Development

In Reception we have been working with the Education Endowment Fund (EEF) and White Rose Maths, to develop our provision both inside and out. Our EYFS team has been having extra training and we have been purchasing exciting new resources.

### Job Opportunity


