The area is defined by the A4174 to the north, starting at the UWE north entrance junction at the north west corner and running east to the River Frome, then south and westwards along the River Frome until South Gloucestershire Council's administrative boundary; then along the boundary west and northwards until the south side of Long Down Avenue, then east along the south side of Long Down Avenue until the footpath that runs northwards along the UWE boundary; it then follows the footpath northwards though UWE to join up with the A4174 UWE north entrance.

Here is a little more about us...

Frenchay is a picturesque village on the edge of Bristol that retains a sense of ownership and community spirit, which can be observed in the school through the commitment, support and participation of the children, parents, teachers, church, locals and governors.

Due to the new housing development (approximately 420 houses) in Frenchay there is a need for additional school places. As a result, the school has expanded to 30 pupils per year group and is now a single form entry. We moved into a new building built to Passivhaus Standards in October 2022. The new building accommodates up to 420 pupils as a 2 form entry school and so will expand further over time. There are many opportunities now open to us as a consequence of this enlargement which is exciting for us as both a school and a community.





This is the first Passivhaus standard school in both the Local authority and also the Bristol Diocese. A very exciting time ahead!



The new building has 14 classrooms, a hall, library, meeting and work rooms as well as office space and break out areas. The outside space boasts a netball and basketball pitch, football pitch as well as new play equipment.



As a Church school, links with the church – St John the Baptist – are close. Clergy visit the school regularly to take collective worship and we use the church as a resource for learning.

This is a happy and caring school with the teachers, governors and parents committed to ensuring the best education for each pupil.

At Frenchay C of E Primary School we try to help pupils understand the world in which they live, providing skills which enable life-long learning. The school places great emphasis on the development of language and encourages questioning and debate, inviting children to communicate their ideas and concepts. We aim to



develop personal and community values which reflect the cultural and religious diversity of modern Britain. We recognise the importance of caring for our environment, both local and global. We are committed to developing our children as independent learners and positive citizens.



Extra-curricular activities

Clubs include football, Robotics, Gardening, and Art and Craft. Some activities are seasonal and some are restricted to specific year groups. All pupils are encouraged to participate in these activities at some time whilst at Frenchay C of E Primary School. Instrumental tuition – children can opt to have tuition in brass, woodwind and strings once they enter into KS2.
